Half Day Kirstenbosch Tour

The garden is one of eight National Botanical Gardens covering five of South Africa's six different biomes. The garden is world-renowned for the beauty and diversity of the Cape Flora it displays and for the magnificence of its setting against the eastern slopes of Table Mountain. Kirstenbosch grows only indigenous South African plants. The estate covers 528 hectares and supports a diverse fynbos flora and natural forest. The cultivated garden (36 hectares) displays collections of South African plants, particularly those from the winter rainfall region of South Africa. A large glass house displays mainly succulent flora from the drier parts of South Africa but also alpine plants and bulb that are in flower.

Soweto Half Day (Morning) Tour

Soweto is a sprawling township, or more accurately, a cluster of townships on the south-western flank of Johannesburg. With a population of over 2 million, the township is the largest black urban settlement in Africa with a rich political history. Soweto was the centre of political campaigns aimed at the overthrow of the apartheid state. The 1976 student uprising started in Soweto and spread to the rest of the country. Many of the sights on this route therefore have political significance.

Apartheid Half Day Tour

The Apartheid Museum is a superb example of design, space and landscape offering the international community a unique South African experience. For anyone wanting to understand and experience what apartheid South Africa was really like, a visit to the Apartheid Museum is fundamental. The museum is a beacon of hope showing the world how South Africa is coming to terms with its oppressive past and working towards a future that all South African can call their own.
